


Develops the Mental Health and Substance Use Workforce

#1: Innovation Projects and State Responses to Opioid Abuse

\$1 Billion provided for state grants to supplement opioid abuse prevention and treatment programs.

Funding intended for activities such as training for health care professionals, increasing access to opioid treatment, prevention, and improving programs that monitor prescription drugs.





#2: Structural Changes to Federal Agencies

#3: Provisions Relating to Medicaid and HIPAA

Medicaid Services (CMS) clarify HIPAA regulations

Requires that the Centers for Medicare and
