

How Many People Misuse Opioids?

About 11.7 million adults in the U.S. misused opioids in the past year. This is 4.8% of the population.


- In comparison, 9.8 million adults have serious mental illnesses.




About 1.5 million adults have both serious mental illness and opioid misuse.



Put another way, 1 out of every 8 adults who misuse opioids also have a serious mental illness. And, 1 in 7 adults with serious mental illness also misuse opioids.

Among all opioids, heroin overdoses have the highest rate


the U.S. in 2016.

Overall, the rate of opioid overdose deaths per 100,000 people has more than doubled from 5.9 in 2006 to 13.3 in 2016. of deaths at 4.9 per 100,000.




The graph below shows that the rate of overdose deaths related to heroin and synthetic narcotics has rapidly increased over the past five years.


Age-Adjusted Rate of Opioid Overdose Deaths per 100,000 by State, 2016
